We have a number of vacancies for paid Holiday staff. Again, please see the web site.

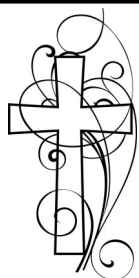

## SUMMER LECTURE SERIES at PAUL 2018

**Tuesday April 24<sup>th</sup>**  
**'Conscientious Objectors and World War One'**

**Clive Barrett of the Anglican Peacemakers Fellowship**

Cornwall had 62 Conscientious Objectors in the First World War and 19 of these came from the parish of Paul making it the community with the highest number of COs. Among them was Wilfred Tregenza of Mousehole who was just setting out on a teaching career when war broke out. His response was to register as a conscientious objector like three of his brothers; warfare being contrary to Jesus' teachings. He joined the Friends' Ambulance Unit (FAU) in France in 1915. When mass conscription was introduced in 1916, Wilfred heard that some COs had been sentenced to be shot. He was so moved by this news that he returned to England to face conscription himself. Sentenced to ten years hard labour, Wilfred spent the rest of the war in various prisons and at Dartmoor he describes 'going up to the church for a service and being stoned on the way'.

Clive will explore the stories behind some of those who took this stand.
